Safeguarding Adults Policy – October 2024

Mission Statement/Introduction

ZKS Martial Arts is committed to ensuring the safety, dignity, and well-being of adults in our care. We believe that everyone, regardless of age, ability, or background, has the right to train in a safe and respectful environment. Our mission is to provide an inclusive environment, free from abuse or neglect, where all individuals are supported to achieve their potential.

Policy statement

ZKS Martial Arts believes that all adults should be able to participate in martial arts in an environment free from abuse, discrimination, and neglect. This policy outlines our commitment to safeguarding adults in our programs and ensuring their well-being. We are dedicated to promoting safe practices and protecting adults from harm.

Scope

This policy applies to all staff, volunteers, instructors, and members of ZKS Martial Arts. It covers the safeguarding of adults, including those at risk, in all ZKS Martial Arts activities.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to ensure the safety of adults participating in ZKS Martial Arts programs. It outlines the procedures for identifying and responding to concerns of abuse, neglect, or exploitation, and provides guidance for staff and volunteers on safeguarding responsibilities.

Implementation

ZKS Martial Arts will implement this policy through the following practices:

- Safe recruitment practices for all staff and volunteers
- A designated safeguarding lead is responsible for handling concerns
- Regular communication of this policy to staff and members
- Training on safeguarding for all instructors and staff
- · Inclusion of adult safeguarding in all risk assessments

Procedures

Concerns about the welfare of an adult can be reported to the designated safeguarding lead. A simple reporting process is in place, which ensures that all concerns are managed in a timely and appropriate manner. For more detailed procedures, please refer to the Instructor's Handbook.

All safeguarding concerns are recorded in line with GDPR and data protection laws. Information is stored securely and shared only with relevant authorities.
